## Lucidophyllous Forest



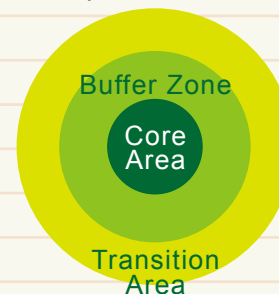
## Aya Biosphere Reserve

Aya Town harbors one of the largest remaining warm-temperate evergreen broad-leaved forests in Japan, what is called a Lucidophyllous Forest. The town has focused on regional development based on harmonious coexistence between humans and nature, while conserving and restoring its forest in cooperation with the private sector. Moreover, it has been a pioneer in promoting organic farming in Japan and has also been instrumental in encouraging local workshops for a variety of handicrafts. As a result, Aya has been formally recognized as a Biosphere Reserve under UNESCO's "Man and Biosphere Programme" which was launched in 1971.

### What is a Biosphere Reserve?

Biosphere Reserves are model sites aimed at not only strictly protecting nature and conserving biodiversity, but also ensuring sustainable development of human life around the forest.

### The Three Zones of Biosphere Reserve



#### ● Core Area

This is the highly valuable area which is strictly protected based on the applicable laws of each country.

#### ● Buffer Zone

This is the surrounding area intended to protect the core area and can be used in so far as humans don't adversely affect the environment.

#### ● Transition Area

People lead sustainable lives in harmony with nature. This area can be used for various social and corporate activities.

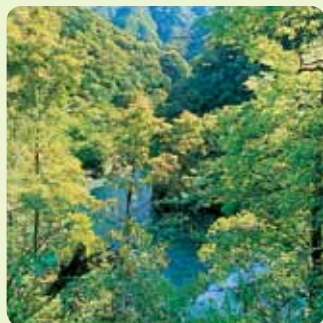


# Aya Teruha Suspension Bridge

This bridge was originally built over the lucidophyllous forest in 1984 to connect humans with nature. In 2011, it was reconstructed to enhance safety. The bridge is 250m long and 1.2m wide. Its highest point is 142m from the surface of the Ayaminami River.

You can enjoy a thrilling “walk in the sky” with a panoramic view of the green forest and blue sky.

## Aya Lucidophyllous Forest (warm-temperate evergreen broad-leaved forest)

Lucidophyllous trees are hardwoods that do not shed their leaves even in winter, having dark green glossy leaves, such as oak (*Quercus*) and beech (*Castanopsis*) trees. They can be found throughout Southwest Japan, Taiwan, Southern China and the Southern foothills of the Himalayas. Aya harbors one of the largest remaining natural lucidophyllous forests in Japan. The forest has been deeply connected with the development of human culture and retains its native flora and fauna, leading to the roots of human life.

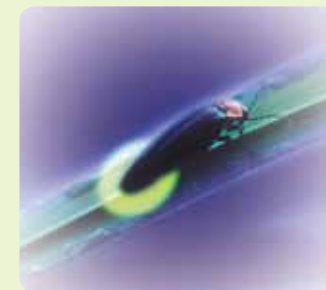
## Aya River Springs

Aya is renowned for its beautiful streams which flow from the lucidophyllous forest. The Aya River Springs were recognized as one of the 100 best water sources in Japan by the Environment Agency (the current Ministry of the Environment) in 1985.



## Firefly Viewing in Otani Stream

From late May to early June, you can see a lot of fireflies (especially *Luciola cruciata*, found only in clean streams) glowing in the night. Thousands of fireflies can be seen in evenings with high temperatures, which promote their emergence. The best conditions are around 8:00 p.m. with no wind.

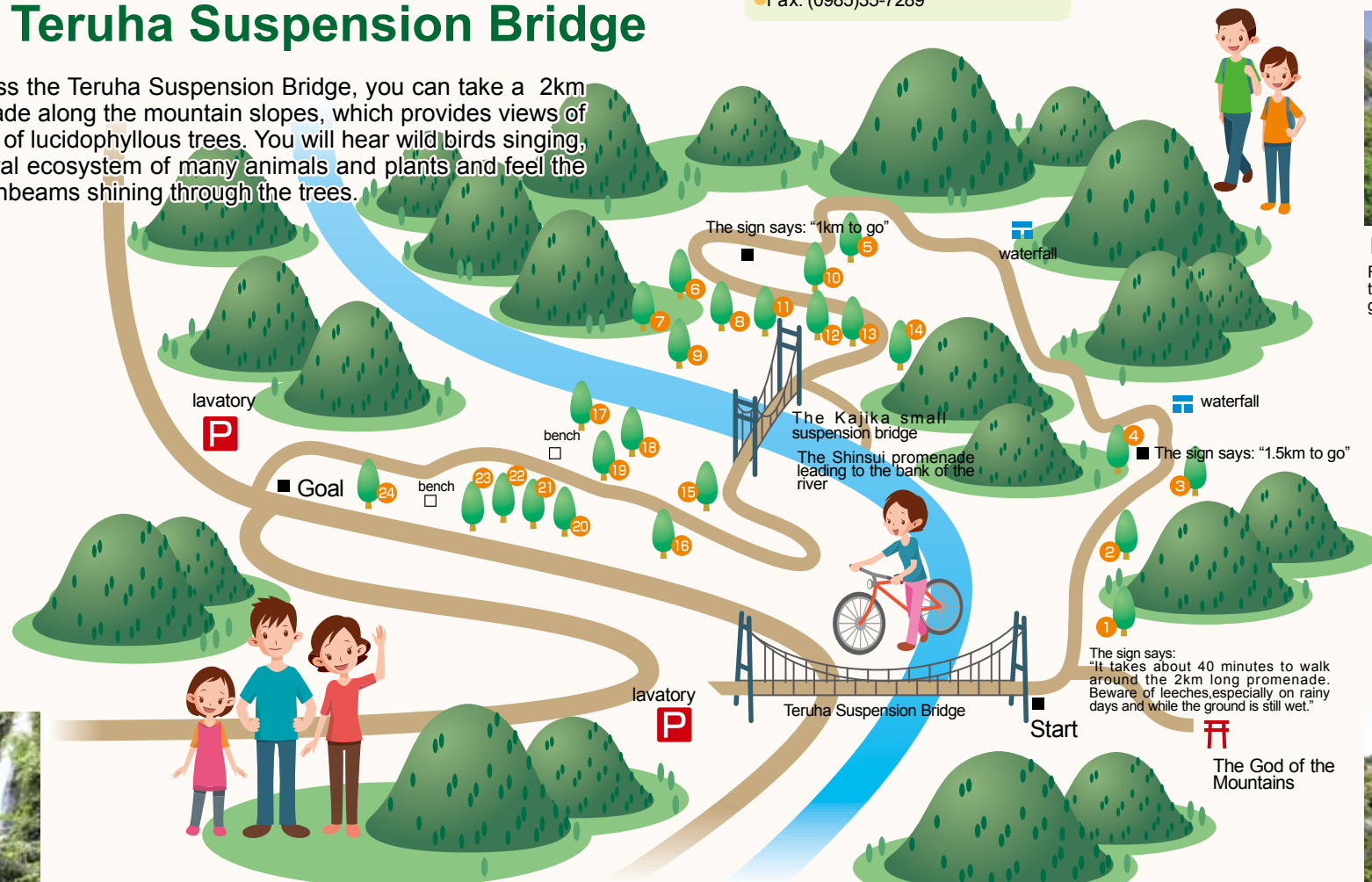
This is intended to enhance the added value of sightseeing, to keep the environment beautiful and to develop the regional economy.



# Promenade around the Aya Teruha Suspension Bridge

After you cross the Teruha Suspension Bridge, you can take a 2km long promenade along the mountain slopes, which provides views of various kinds of lucidophyllous trees. You will hear wild birds singing, see the natural ecosystem of many animals and plants and feel the warmth of sunbeams shining through the trees.

**Sempiro Waterfall**

Fresh water cascades down through the lucidophyllous forest. The waterfall is located in about 5.5km down the river from the Teruha suspension bridge.



**Fresh Green Leaves**

From April to May, lucidophyllous trees are beautiful with fresh green leaves shining in the sun.



**Wild Cherry Blossoms**

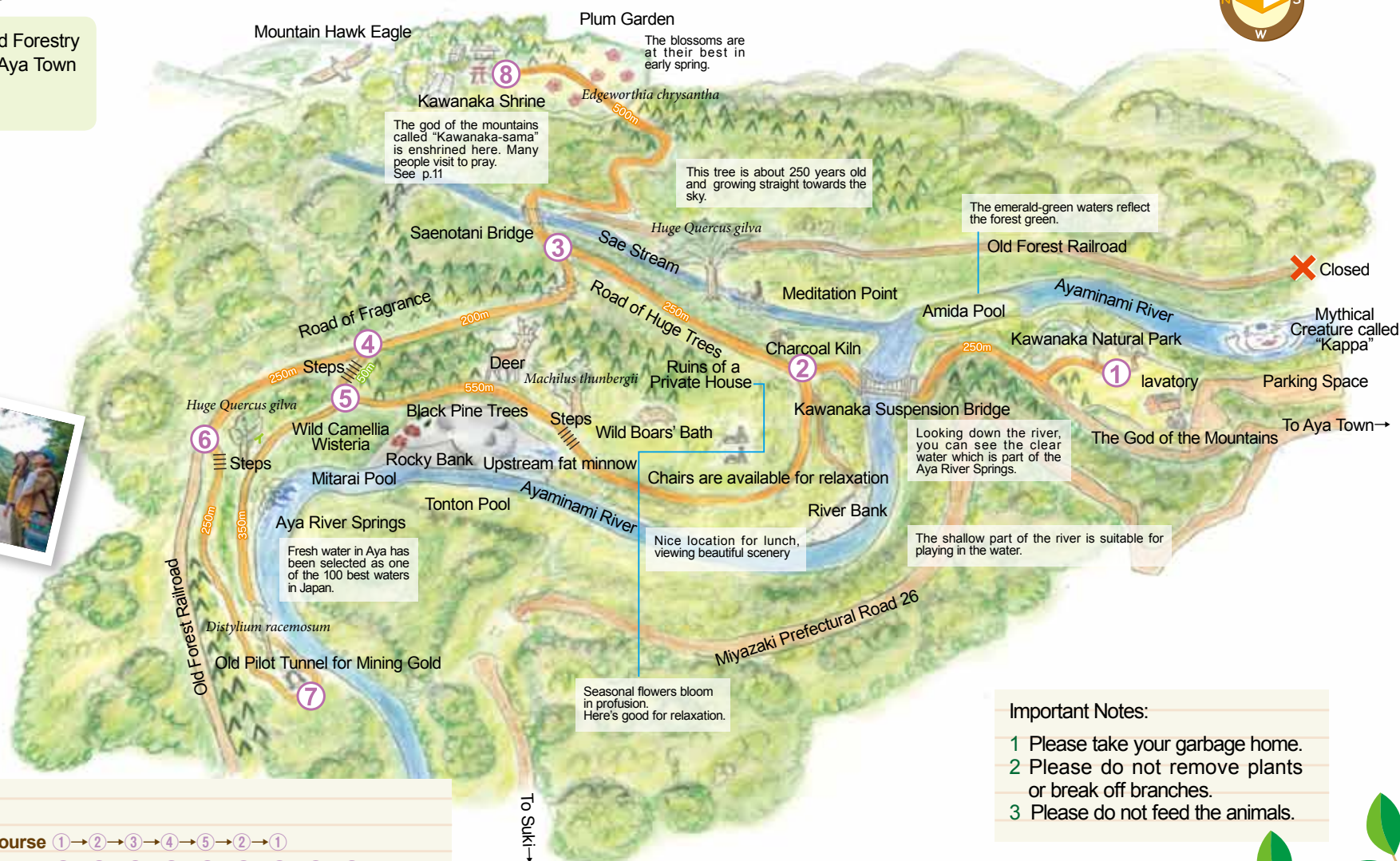
From mid- to late-March, the wild cherry blossoms are in full bloom. The contrast between the pale pink blossoms and the green of the forest is breathtaking.

# Aya Castle

Demolished in the 19th century, Aya castle was reconstructed in 1985 based on historical research on the 14th century conducted by the Japan Castle Foundation. It is made of wood and a historical museum has been built inside. You can look back on the town's history and commemorate the feudal warriors.

## Lucidophyllous Forest Museum

This is located near the Teruha Suspension Bridge. There are various exhibits, including carvings of birds which inhabit the Aya forest, and agricultural and forestry tools from the old days.

## Wooden Statue of Seated Amida Buddha of the Kawanaka Shrine

This is believed to have been made between the 14th and 16th centuries. In the 19th century, when there was a movement to abolish Buddhism, local people hid the statue in a cave and saved it. At present, the public is permitted to visit the statue only once a year during the Shrine Festival in November, though it is situated in the Kawanaka Shrine.

## *Quercus gilva*

(Designated by Miyazaki Prefecture as a Natural Treasure)

It is estimated to be about 680 years old, nearly 20m high and about 6.8m in circumference around the trunk.

It is said that the first lord of Aya castle planted it on his premises. A stone monument carved with Sanskrit characters is placed near the root.





# Aya International Handicrafts Pavilion

Handmade crafts created by a variety of local craftsmen are always displayed and sold here. Visitors can try to create their own works at workshops specializing in pottery and weaving, and learn traditional skills and techniques.

## Great Sword-smith, Kunihiro Tanaka

This is the statue of a renowned sword-smith, Kunihiro Tanaka. He was born in Aya Town and began to make swords as a boy. The sword he made in 1586 has been designated as an important cultural asset in Japan. Some of his swords

are displayed in the Aya Castle Museum. His monument is placed at the site of his birth and his statue is located near the entrance to the Aya Castle.



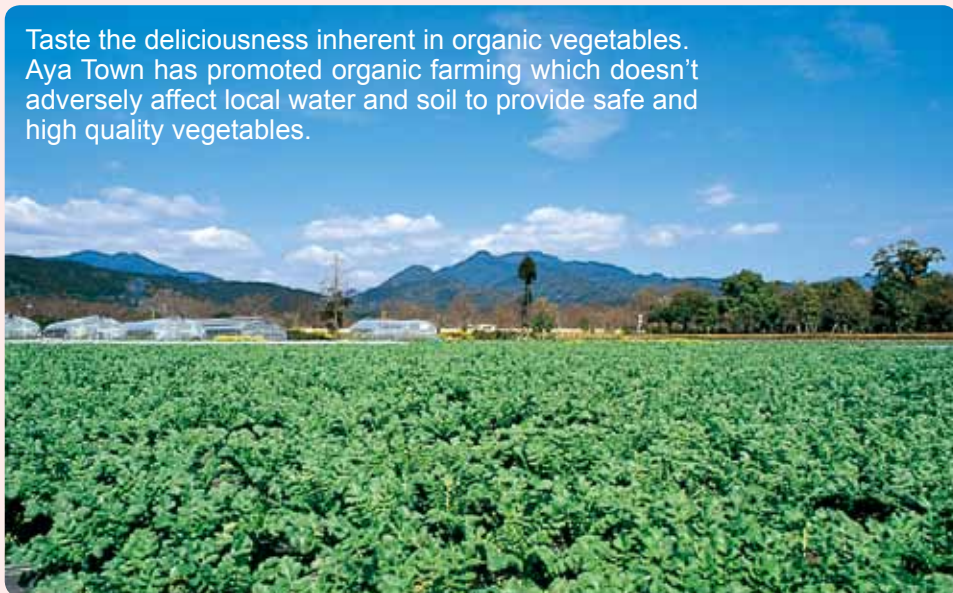
## Aya Honmono Shopping Center

### Organic Farming in Aya

Aya Town policy is to develop the town, while conserving natural ecosystems. The Ordinance Relating to Promotion of Organic Farming was established in 1988. The local government made efforts to introduce environmental-friendly farming methods and the self-certification system for local farm products to ensure food safety.

Since 2001, the town has been designated as a Japanese Agricultural Standards Registered Certifying Body.



### The Locally-grown and Locally-consumed Principle

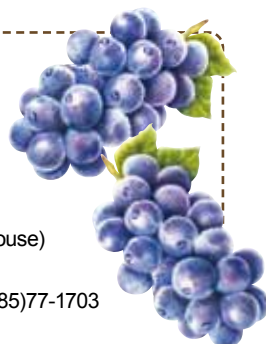

## Unkai Brewery and Shusen-no-Mori

You can taste as much as you want of Shochu (a locally distilled alcoholic beverage) and wine, which are produced using fresh water from Aya river springs. Local beer and dishes are served in the restaurants. There are souvenir shops which sell local sweets, beverages and handicrafts.

# Seasonal Events in Aya Town

## Event 1 Aya Hinayama Festival (Girls' Festival)

This is held from late February to early March. Wishing for the healthy growth of girls, local residents decorate dolls wearing kimonos on a mountain-like platform created using natural objects such as trees and rocks. You can see a variety of displays, which are worth seeing, at about 20 places in the town.

Since around the 17th century, when the eldest daughter was born, there has been a traditional custom that relatives and neighbors would pick up big or old trees and reproduce the mountains and rivers in a back room to celebrate the birth.

To preserve this tradition, the Aya Chamber of Commerce and Industry Business Women's Club revived the event in 2001.



## Event 2 Otokoyama Festival (Boys' Festival)

This takes place from late April to early May. Wishing for the healthy growth of boys, local residents display dolls wearing armor and traditional helmets on a mountain-like platform which reproduces the splendid scenery of deep mountains using natural materials such as rocks and moss. During this period, there is a procession of children dressed like medieval warriors.



## Event 3 Fireworks Displays

In mid-September, about 4,000 rounds of fireworks are displayed from the banks of the Ayaminami River. The sound of fireworks echoes through the mountains and the huge displays attract many spectators.



## Event 4 Aya Marathon through the Lucidophyllous Forest

This is an annual event held in late October.

Since 1986, it has been popular among everyone from athletes to children due to the beautiful scenery. Over 7,000 runners participate in the event.



## Event 5 Aya Horse Race

This event takes place annually on the first Sunday in November. It is so popular that as many as 20,000 tourists come to see the horses competing up close. There are several kinds of races involving racehorses and ponies.

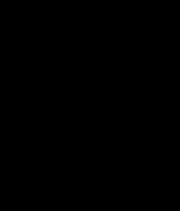


# Artisans of Aya Town

Over the past decades, a number of artisans specializing in different crafts have been drawn to the charms of Aya, which harbors one of the world's rarest natural lucidophyllous forests. Aya Town is now home to many craftspeople who, while observing Japanese traditional culture, continue to create new, original artworks of genuine quality reminding us of the warmth the local natural environment provides.

## Aya Handicrafts Festival

This is held annually late November. More than 40 local workshops participate in this event to display and sell their products including handmade woodcrafts, pottery, textiles and processed foods. Approximately 15,000 people flock to this event from inside and outside Miyazaki Prefecture.

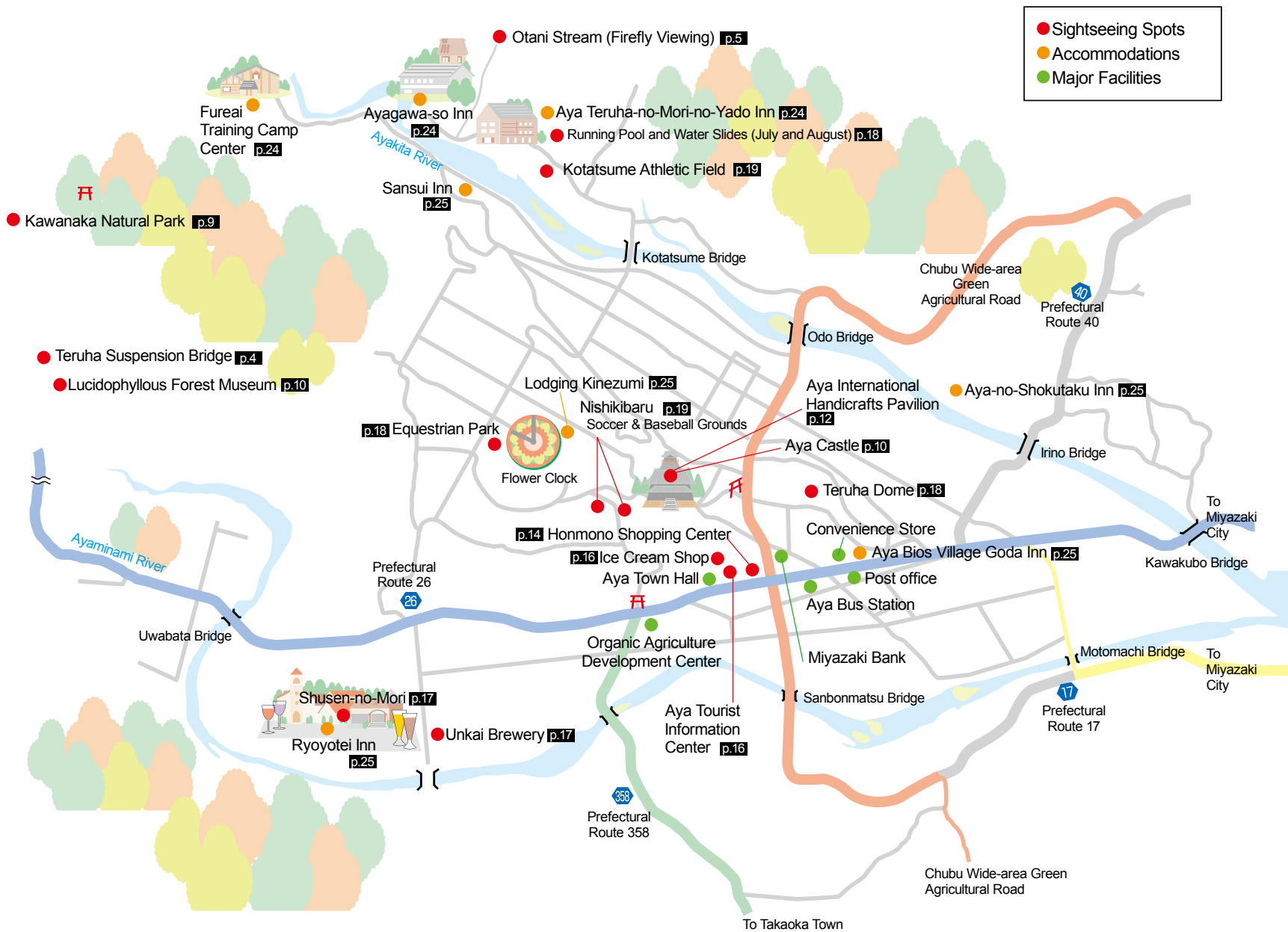
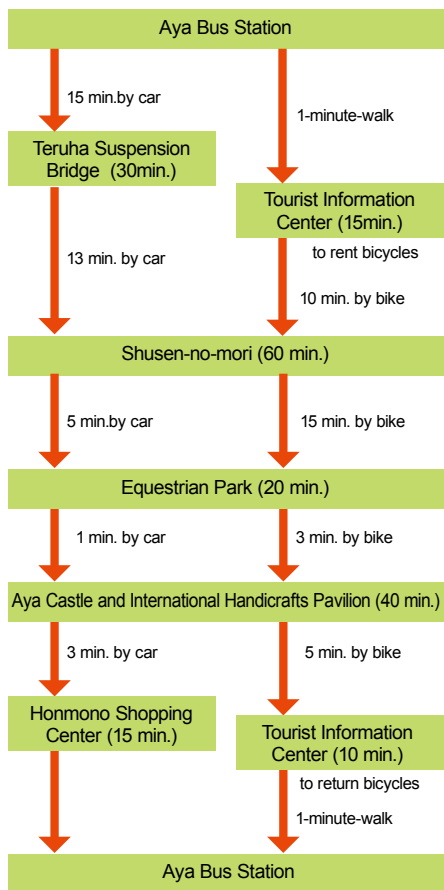

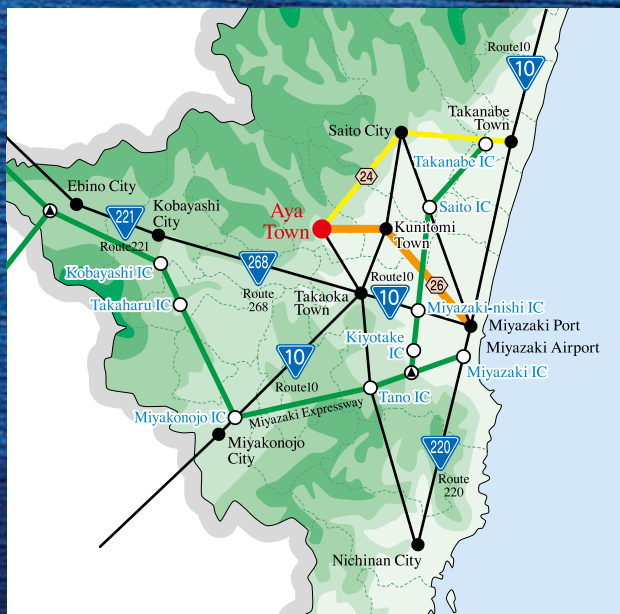
